January Demonstrator: Chris Cozen



READY or NOT

Have you ever read an art book and thought, "Well, that was a waste of time.... nothing to learn here." Then, ten years later, you picked up that same book (intending to discard it) only to discover to your surprise, that there is something in there worth investigating after all. Then you wonder, "How did I miss that? THIS is good stuff."

Perhaps the reason is that we grow and change every day. What we were not ready to learn ten years ago, may now be totally spot on. Teaching kids taught me that not all children are ready to learn the same material at the same time. And adults are no different. Before we can be receptive to new ideas, we need to be ready.

Most artists pass through fairly standard phases of development. Generally, beginning artists are focused on methods and techniques. This stage targets: simply how to get the paint on the paper; mix colors effectively; handle brushes; learn gimmicks and tricks that make the painting process easier and produce the results we want.

Intermediate artists tend to focus on how to manage form, space, composition, symbolic language, and the elements and principles of design. It is a broad area that may take many more years to master than techniques and has more of a conceptual basis to learning. While the beginner's needs deal mainly with concrete methods and skills, this intermediate level involves ideas over techniques.

Eventually, the Advanced artist, presumably having mastered the nuts and bolts of art, may spend more time focused on subtle concepts of mood and personal expression... trying to inject expressiveness, philosophy and aesthetic beauty into what they portray. Not to say that beginners don't aspire to the same goal... it's just that there are many concrete stages to work through before this more expressive phase may become the primary objective.

The bottom line is, keep moving forward AND don't throw out those books that you may think are irrelevant today. For tomorrow, they may just be exactly what you need.

Smooth • Watery • Glowing • Textured

Ingredients

- Brushes – all shapes and sizes
- Palette of bright fresh paint
- 3–4 pieces of watercolor paper
- 1–2 water containers
- Pencils, erasers, markers, pens
- Paper towels
- Optional reference photos

Instructions

1. Mix and mingle with like-minded artists.
2. Lay out materials and mix thoroughly.
3. Wet paint and/or paper — prepare to be amazed.
4. Let dry. Repeat as needed.
5. Wrap or store finished artwork once fully dry.
